CONGRATULATIONS, SCECINA COMMUNITY

Scecina has again earned an **A** grade from the Indiana Department of Education school accountability rating system.

The state's school accountability system uses multiple measurements of academic performance and progress, including graduation rates; standardized test scores in Mathematics and English/Language arts; and measurable indicators of college and career readiness. Schools receive grades from A-F.

Indiana's Growth Model tracks students' academic progress from one school year to the next using standardized test scores. A significant dimension of Scecina's **A** rating is the students' test score growth from middle school to high school.

"I commend our students for believing in their growth potential, our teachers for fostering a growth mindset, and our parents for all they do," said Scecina President **Joe Therber**.

President Therber said he was especially happy to see the school rated highly for preparing students for college and career. "School accountability is but a pathway to higher goals," he said. "At Scecina, we want every college-bound student to identify and gain acceptance to his or her college or university of choice." ■



STATE RECOGNITION FOR AP EXAM SCORES

Scecina was recognized this year by Indiana Superintendent of Public Instruction **Jennifer McCormick**, Ph.D., for being one of only 73 schools in the state with over 25% of their students scoring 3 or higher on the Advanced Placement exams. The school received a personal congratulatory note from Dr. McCormick.

"As you know, Advanced Placement courses are a great benefit to Indiana students," she wrote.

"These classes challenge students and prepare them for life beyond high school. I want to applaud the teachers and staff at your school for their commitment to challenging students inside the classroom and providing them rigorous learning opportunities. I cannot say thank you enough." ■

MEETING PEOPLE'S NEEDS

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

There were more than a few tears as 15 Spanish students said goodbye to Scecina one September morning.

There were long embraces and photos taken with phones. Over their three-week stay, they formed close relationships with their host families and with the students of Scecina.

The students hailed from Andalusia in southern Spain; several came from the capital city of Seville and others live in smaller towns. They came as part of a short-term program of Foreign Links Around the Globe (FLAG), an international student exchange program.

"It's great that Scecina has the ability to bring people together," said **John Hegarty**, Scecina's Vice President of Community Initiatives and also the head of the international student program. "It does foster life-long friendships. It was amazing for me to see the close friendships that developed in such a short time."

Victoria Gomez Fernandez, from the town of Ubrique in the province of Cadiz, said the people were her favorite thing about Indianapolis.

She enjoyed listening to American radio and discovering the flavor of pumpkin. She bought a pumpkin at the orchard and made sure her host family carved a jack-o-lantern, a tradition not practiced in Spain. She also bought a gold-metallic pair of Converse tennis shoes.

Scecina is hosting 26 international students from China, India, Thailand and Nigeria for the whole year. The school also welcomed more short-stay students this year from France, Australia, New Zealand, and China. ■

SCECINA MODERNIZES 24 CLASSROOMS

Scecina's summer project to modernize 24 classrooms was a big undertaking. Thanks to generous donors, more than \$400,000 was raised for new ceilings and floors, paint, electrical service, windows, blinds, dry erase boards, and air conditioning units.

The completed classrooms now are full of students and teachers, desks and computers.

"Succeeding in this project took a big team of people," said Scecina President **Joe Therber** during a ceremony after a school Mass on November 21 to honor those who helped with the modernization project. "Certain individuals from the Archdiocese of Indianapolis, Scecina Board of Directors, business community, and the Scecina staff played instrumental roles in the project.

"The leaders whom we are thanking today are important parts of our Scecina Community and help to make our school better and stronger every day," he said.

FATHER TOM DAY

Tom Griffin '62 says his answer will always be "yes" when he is called upon to serve the Scecina Community.

As a U.S. military veteran, every year he attends the annual Father Tom Mass. This year, he was the honoree. He was awarded the prestigious Father Tom Award at the annual celebration on Oct. 24.

Griffin was born on Oct. 26, 1944, just two days after Father Tom died at sea during World War II.

In 1963, Tom, a lifelong parishioner at Little Flower Parish, enlisted in the U.S. Air Force and was stationed in Germany from 1964 to 1967, serving the nation in security and law enforcement.

Scecina President **Joe Therber** noted how Griffin has dedicated much of his life to serving Scecina.

Those who nominated Tom named some of the work he has done as a volunteer: countless hours reviewing yearbooks to update the school's database, being a key member of the Scecina Veterans Committee, giving his insights and encouragement for the bronze bust of Father Tom in the rotunda, sharing his time and hospitality for his 55-year class reunion, and attending numerous Scecina sporting events to support our students and families.

"Tom is one of the most likeable people you could ever hope to meet," said President Therber. "I know that I have grown as a person by knowing Tom and am grateful to call him a friend."

In his remarks at the Father Tom Mass, Tom said, "Sometimes we come to a point where we try to do just enough to get by. I don't think Father Tom was ever tempted by that or, if he was, he quickly dismissed it."

Griffin pledged to "continue trying to give that little extra to help Scecina Memorial where needed so as to honor Father Tom as well as past recipients of this award." ■

EXPLORING HEALTHCARE CAREERS

Each day, some students board a Scecina bus and in a few minutes arrive at a major hospital, Community Hospital East.

They are taking a new class, Health Occupations, which combines classroom instruction with experience inside the health system. They spend nearly two class periods almost every day at the hospital, where they will rotate among 11 stations during the year. Most have a strong interest in a health profession.

Senior **Sam Traylor**, who is considering physical therapy or sports medicine, helped at

Community's work-site clinic for employees. Senior **Katie Circharo** is comforting patients going through chemotherapy.

"The students can begin to build those early relationships in a healthcare environment while learning the foundation of working in a professional environment," said Tammy Hartley, Community's volunteer coordinator. "It also allows students to witness and learn compassionate care."

In class, taught by Science Department Chair **Sarah Smith**, the students study anatomy and diseases. They wrote a paper about early medicine practiced by the Greeks, Romans, Chinese and Egyptians. They also learn about legal issues in the health field.



"We are honored to partner with Scecina and support their mission for education and hopefully we will attract the best and the brightest to consider healthcare as a career choice," said **Paige Dooley**, Community's Vice President of Patient Care Services and Chief Nurse Executive for the East Region. ■

BAKING CLUB

The Baking Club has made dozens upon dozens of cookies and other treats for Scecina events, including class reunions, board meetings and concerts.

Jean (Kreich) Donlan '85 and **Therese Myers**, a former Scecina parent, are the moderators. There are about 23 student bakers, including senior **Sam Stauffer**.

"Men should learn to bake," Sam said. He's made pies, cakes, cookies, Rice Krispie treats, cheesecake, Chex Mix, and pizzas.

The young bakers also learn patience. "Getting a cheesecake right can be challenging, and cake pops are labor-intensive," said Mrs. Donlan.

Baking Club teaches important lessons:

1. Reading recipes and measuring ingredients are great brain exercises.
2. Baking and cooking are skills students can use forever.
3. Creating food for the community creates servant leaders.

You could say the Baking Club feeds the soul at Scecina. ■

STUDENT COUNCIL

The Student Council organizes activities such as dances, Homecoming spirit week and Red and Gold Week. The main goal of Student Council has been to get as many students as possible involved in school events and to provide a safe space to socialize, said moderator and teacher **Nikki (Runner) Rosswurm '05**.

The group's reach goes beyond Scecina's campus to the larger community. The Student Council's annual canned food and sock drives and its Christmas giving fund are tangible signs of one of Scecina's core values, stewardship: "receiving, cultivating, and sharing God's gifts gratefully and generously."

The Student Council, through its governing structure, also helps student live out another Scecina value, servant leadership.

FOOTBALL RUSHES TO SEMI-STATE

The Crusaders football team took Scecina fans on an exciting season-long ride, all the way through the Class 2A Semi-State game of the state tournament.

The Crusaders won the Indiana Crossroads Conference championship and finished the season 12-2. Their only losses were to Class 4A Roncalli during the regular season and to eventual state champion South Ridge in the Class 2A Semi-State game on Nov. 18.

"The thing that made this season so successful and so special were the players," said head coach **Ott Hurrle '70**. "The 11 seniors on the team were amazing in their leadership but, as one of the seniors said: 'It was the underclassmen buying into what we were doing that made the season so much fun.'"

The team also played a special game at Lucas Oil Stadium on Oct. 6. The Class 2A No. 3 Crusaders beat conference and Catholic school rival Cardinal Ritter on the state's biggest football stage. The Crusaders topped the Class 3A No. 6 Raiders 27-14 to capture the Indiana Crossroads Conference championship.

Thanks to an enthusiastic and supportive Scecina fan base, the Crusaders' crowd was the biggest of the night. Event organizers told Scecina Athletic Director **Jason Kehrer '88** that the Crusaders had sold the most tickets of any of the four teams that played (Columbus North and Bloomington South played the second game.) "They said we more than surpassed expectations," he said.

Senior co-captains **Collin Connor**, **Drew Lowery**, and **Jack Wright** led the team. Wright won the team's Mental Attitude and Outstanding Teammate awards, while Lowery was Most Valuable Player.

Offensive lineman **Patrick Lyons '19** and wide receiver **David Baker '20** won All-City honors, along with Connor (defensive lineman). Baker was the MVP and Wright was the All-Academic player for the Lucas Oil game.

"I will remember this team with a great deal of fondness as the years go by," said Hurrle. "That being said, we are all looking forward to next season and plan to play 'one more week.'" ■

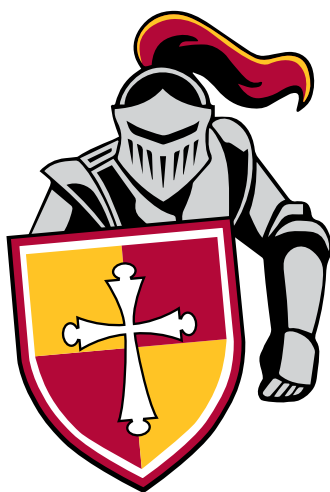

CROSS COUNTRY

The girls cross country team finished third at the Indiana Crossroads Conference (ICC) Championships and sixth at the New Palestine Sectional. Sophomore **Abby Page** was voted the team's MVP, placing first for the team in all but two races this season. Page and four other Crusaders -- senior **Isabelle Leffler** and juniors **Josie DeFreese**, **Logan Moss**, and **Spencer Moss** -- advanced to the Rushville Regional Championships, marking the most individual qualifiers at one championship in school history. Logan Moss was named Honorable Mention Academic All-State.

The boys team finished as the ICC Championships' runners-up. For the first time since 2009, the team advanced to the Rushville Regional Championships. Seniors **Henry Egan** and **Holden Martin** and freshman **Jacob Sitzman** earned All-Conference Honors. Egan and Martin qualified for the Shelbyville Semi-State Championships and earned All-City, All-Sectional and All-Regional honors. Both Egan and Martin were named Honorable Mention Academic All-State. Egan's time of 16:09.35 and Martin's 16:38.00 are the first and fourth fastest recorded times in school history. ■

The team went 5-9 in the regular season and 6-10 overall and advanced to the finals of the Sectionals. This was another record for me as a coach. Not only did we once again better our team record, we also won the Ritter Speedway Team Invitational. This was the highlight of the year. The team dominated Beech Grove and bounced back after a tough 2-3 loss to Ritter to beat Speedway 3-2, clinching not only the team title but also individual champions at No. 2 and No. 3 singles. ■

MEET DR. JOE BRETTNACHER



In August 2017, Joseph (Joe) Brettnacher, Ph.D., became the principal of Scecina Memorial High School.

Dr. Brettnacher most recently was Superintendent of Schools for the Diocese of Columbus (Ohio), where he oversaw the operations of 53 Catholic schools. He has served as principal of two Catholic high schools in Indiana during his career, Central Catholic High School in Lafayette and Marian High School in Mishawaka. Dr. Brettnacher also has assisted Indiana schools to gain or sustain accreditation status in the State of Indiana through his role on a statewide committee.

Dr. Brettnacher and his wife, Pam, have two married children and three grandchildren. His top three priorities in life are God, family and Catholic education.

We asked our faculty, staff and Scecina Community to submit questions to help us get to know Dr. Brettnacher better. Here are his answers.

What did you teach before you became a principal?

I taught Industrial Technology classes. Specifically, drafting, woodworking, and communication. As a vocational teacher, I taught Graphic Arts and Computer Programming. Also, I taught a construction class for students with mild learning disabilities.

What was your favorite thing about being a teacher?

Being a teacher means you have an opportunity to have a direct and positive impact on students' lives. It is not the subject matter taught that makes a difference. To make a difference, a good teacher has to have a good relationship with his or her students; care about their well-being; challenge them spiritually, intellectually, physically, and socially; and have a willingness to bare his or her soul. I thank God for helping me to have a positive impact on several students' lives.

How is Scecina different from other schools that you have been at?

Scecina has a rich, diverse student population, and community. I feel blessed to be a part of such a community. Also, everyone believes in and lives the school's mission as they strive to walk in the inspiring footsteps of Father Thomas Scecina and give that little extra.

What has surprised you the most about your time here at Scecina thus far?

I am surprised by how hard the faculty, staff, administration, alumni, and community work to improve the quality of education for the students and to ensure the school's existence for the next generation of students.

After serving at Scecina for a few months, can you share with us how you have felt blessed by Scecina and the community?

I have felt blessed:

- To have the opportunity to share with students their successes and struggles
- By God to help students live the Gospel
- To worship God, on a daily basis along with the students, faculty, staff, and community
- To work with President Therber, who works tirelessly to make sure Scecina strives for and achieves excellence
- To work with the dedicated administration, faculty, and staff
- To feel welcomed by the students, faculty, staff, and community, and
- Much more!

Can you name one vital lesson or

truth you have learned in your 20 years as a Catholic school educator?

The one vital lesson I have learned is humility in the presence of God and others. I believe St. Mother Teresa said it best: "We can do no great things -- only small things with great love." I hope I have accomplished some small things with great love.

What is the best advice you would give to parents to have successful children in life, not just school?

To pray to God that your love, care, and belief in your children will help them to fulfill His destiny for them, which is to become saints.

What do you like to do to relax?

I like to spend time with God, my wife, and family. I feel refreshed when I run, lift weights, work out, read, and learn something new.

How do you demonstrate servant leadership? What plans do you have for incorporating service more into the Scecina student experience?

I think anyone can demonstrate servant leadership by helping the needy or, just as Father Scecina stated, by giving that little extra.

My plans to incorporate more service into the Scecina experience is to determine whether the House-Family System is a right fit for the school.

The House-Family System helps create an environment where every student feels at home. The system has a support system (multiple opportunities for servant leadership), healthy peer relationships, people to turn to with questions, great adult role models (servant leaders), and a place to be themselves. Every house contains members of the faculty and staff to mentor (an example of servant leadership) and provides

pastoral care (servant leader) to all our students. The system provides multiple students the opportunities for leadership and service.

You seem to have a very deep faith. What is the story of that development?

I do not perceive myself as having a deeper faith than others. However, I do have a strong faith in God and the Catholic Church, but I am still a sinner and fall short of what God calls me to be.

My faith development began with my parents, who made sure we went to church every Sunday and holy days of obligation. My wife and family have participated in five of the seven sacraments (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation, Penance, and Matrimony). I admired my parents for their faith. My Aunt Margaret taught me God desires a personal relationship with all His children. I developed a personal relationship with God through daily prayer.

What is your favorite memory of when you were in high school/what was high school like for you?

My favorite memory was when I got cut from the baseball team and my teacher and the cross-country coach, Mr. Phil Hurt, came up to me and told me he believed in me, saw leadership potential, and told me I could become a good student-athlete. He told the same thing to hundreds of young men and women during his tenure as a coach. I needed someone to believe in me. Mr. Hurt went on to teach me the value of a strong work ethic, formed me into a good athlete, and demonstrated through his actions how to become a leader.

What's the most interesting thing about you that most people don't know?

I once partnered with my cousin in a business called Mind, Body, and Soul. Through Power-Lifting Magazine we sold hypnosis tapes and my weight-lifting routines. My routines calculated, for each athlete, new weight-lifting goals. My program calculated new goals based on the previous maximum amounts of weight lifted for the major muscle groups (bench-press, squats, deadlifts, and cleans). I used the theory of accumulation (more repetitions and a lower amount of weight at the beginning of the cycle), and intensification, (a gradual reduction in repetitions and an increase in the amount of weight lifted). At the end of the 12 weeks, the athlete attempts his or her calculated weight goal. The theory of accumulation and intensification keeps the body in a constant state of shock to continuously increase strength.

In my 20s and 30s, I used my weight-lifting program to become an elite, national power-lifter in the American Drug-Free Power-Lifting Association.

What was your worst subject in school?

My worst subject in high school was mathematics (algebra and geometry). It is ironic, when I worked on my doctorate and dissertation, math (statistics) became my favorite subject. ■

In my message in last year's annual report, I discussed my excitement about the future of Sccecina Memorial High School. Well, that excitement certainly was rewarded by the many significant accomplishments of this past school year. High on the achievement list is the over \$1.8 million raised in support of maintaining and enhancing the quality of education offered to Sccecina students. This generous support from the Sccecina Community also enabled the summer renovation of 24 classrooms, most of which had not been updated since 1953.

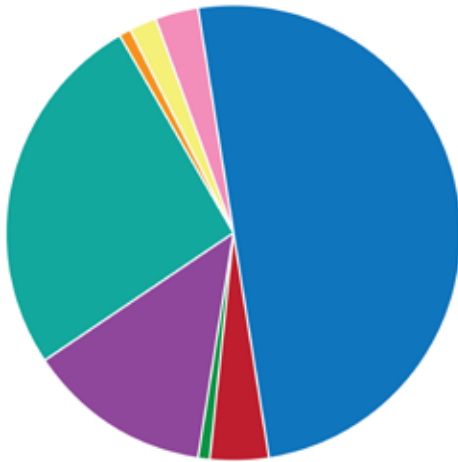

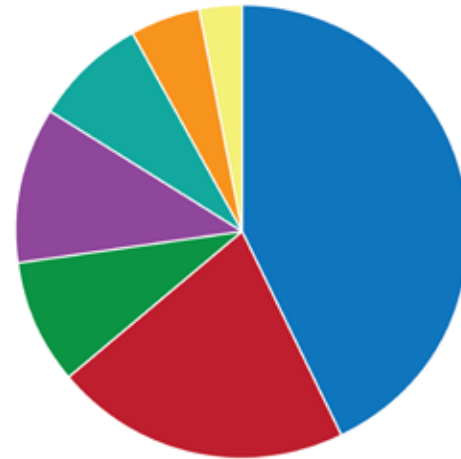

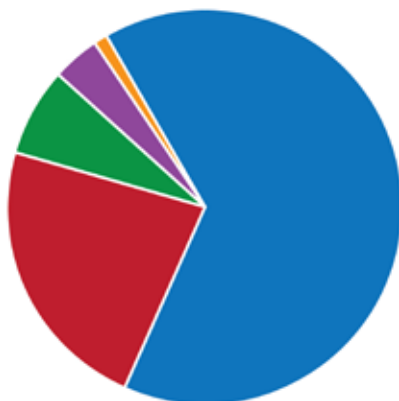

"At first, he was a little confused," said Peggy, "But then, after the second veteran walked up, everyone began to become very emotional, especially those receiving the quilts."

Lt. Col. Lisa Kopczynski helped present the Quilts of Valor and received her own quilt. Lt. Col. Kopczynski has been actively serving for more than 30 years in the Indiana Army National Guard and was deployed to Iraq in 2008. Her parents, **Michael** and **Martha (Griffo) Bell**, graduated from Scecina in 1961.

The emotional presentation healed some wounds for veterans in the Class of 1967. Some comments from those in attendance:

"It was the emotional highlight of the evening."

"You helped melt away that anger, you have ripped out those terrible seeds by honoring him with the Quilt of Valor."

"The honor you bestowed on your classmates was without parallel."

"He never let go of the anger in the pit of his stomach. He said when he was wrapped in that quilt on Saturday, the anger was just lifted from him. He said he never felt so unburdened since his return."

"I don't think I have EVER seen him so proud of anything before."

"If I'm down and need a hug, I can just go get the quilt."

"The evening of the reunion, many classmates came up to tell us how much they appreciated the time and efforts we made in producing the quilts. It was emotional for all of us," Peggy said. ■

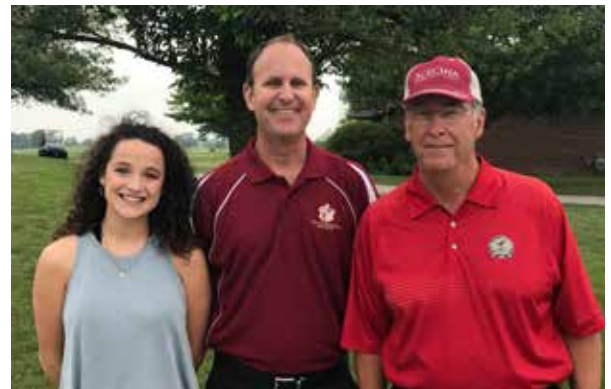

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY TO CCF

Secina congratulates the Catholic Community Foundation Inc. (CCF) as it celebrates its 30th anniversary this year. Since 1987, the CCF has been helping the people of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis use endowments to create long-term financial stability for the Catholic ministries in Central and Southern Indiana.



The CCF manages \$180 million in assets with more than 470 endowment funds and donor-advised funds. Over the last 30 years, CCF has awarded more than \$105.5 million in grants to parishes, schools and Catholic agencies.

The CCF works with Archdiocesan ministries, including agencies, parishes and schools like Secina Memorial High School, to create and grow their permanent endowment funds.
